Why I Joined EWMA

Like most good stories, there is a bit of a buildup before the hero emerges and saves the day. Please bear with me for a few paragraphs as I set the stage and give you some background.

I had been a longtime GWRRA member. I believe I joined in 2005. My last membership year was 2019. Like many others, I just *lost that lovin' feeling* with the organization. The organization... not the people... with whom I had friendships. It did pain me to drop my membership, but I did feel that the organization no longer fed my soul.

I tried to be a part of another motorcycle organization. No cost membership fee, a local group, part of a national organization and a host of regional and national events. I gave it a try. Nice folks, but something was missing for me.

In the fall of 2021we moved from Ontario to Alberta. Shipped the household furniture and drove the car across the country. Stored my motorcycle and trailer and flew back to Ontario in the late spring of 2022 and began the bike ride to our new home in Alberta.

I had decided to travel through the US, as the weather going north through Canada at the end of May was still a bit too cool. Also, as I would not be coming back east for a while, I needed to see a few places that I had missed on many of my past trips. One of these places was Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. You see, I needed to have a chat with Phil. I felt he needed some encouragement to up his weather forecast accuracy. However, he was sleeping and didn't have the courtesy to get up to see a Canadian who had been a big fan for many years. I guess you can't expect much from a groundhog!

From Punxsutawney I rode further south, avoiding storms, via West Virginia and Kentucky. Finally, onto Interstate 64 towards St. Louis.

At this point, my trip took a major turn for the worse. About 10 miles east of Mount Vernon, Illinois on I-64 in a construction zone, I hit a couple of bumps in the highway. The trailer hitch on my

VTX1800R was installed on the inside of the rear fender of the motorcycle, fastened with three bolts on each side at the top. The right-side bolts sheared and the right side of the hitch dropped and contacted the top edge of the rear tire. The tailgating traffic fell



back in the cloud of burning rubber. I smelled nothing and only saw the cloud in my mirrors. I drove carefully (?) to the Goshen Road rest stop in the westbound lanes. That was the longest mile I have ever ridden! Stopped safely as shredded rubber fell to the ground from the inside of the rear fender. Tire still held air. I guess Bridgestone is now my favorite brand!

A call to AAA brought a flat-bed tow truck and a search of bike shops in Mount Vernon area lead me to a place listed as House of V-twin on Perkins Avenue and Billy, 618-237-5959.

Billy and his staff waited past closing time to get the motorcycle and trailer off the flat-bed and safely into his shop and we chained up the trailer outside. Tire was on order with a two-business day delivery.

With a great hotel recommendation from Billy, I was off to what would be my home for the next five nights. You

see, the weekend was coming and the two-day delivery was business days so the weekend wouldn't count.

Once the tire arrived, Billy and the team removed the damaged hitch from the motorcycle, installed and balanced the new Bridgestone rear tire and I was on my way. I left the trailer with the promise to return to get it.

With my trip now five days extended and a need to get home, I took a more direct route. Three days and thirty hours later I was home. I realized that a six day and sixty hour return round trip was going to be difficult to execute.

For GWRRA members I think it would be a simple task of looking through your Gold Book and finding someone to help at lease retrieve your trailer from the motorcycle shop. I wasn't currently a GWRRA member, so I emailed a contact I found with the other motorcycle group I had joined. No response. I waited but nothing happened. Nothing ever happened.

I decided that it would be worth a try to see if I could find a GWRRA member who would help out an ex-member. I looked through the online Gold Book and there were a couple of chapters close to Mt. Vernon. As I didn't know which to call I decided to call the GWRRA District Director for Illinois, Bob Adams.

I called the number listed and got Bob's voicemail. I left a message and really didn't expect much. To my surprise and delight, Bob called me back within 10 minutes! We had a great conversation about GWRRA and this new initiative called EWMA. Bob was excited about the future with EWMA. Bob was also willing to help me out.

Within a few weeks my trailer had a new home, the gear I had left in the trailer that I couldn't strap on the back of my motorcycle was shipped back to me and I now have new friendships in Illinois.

You see, GWRRA for me was always about the people. Now with EWMA I have that people thing back. People willing to help, to extend a hand to someone in need, to be a kind human.

And that is why I joined EWMA.
